We completed a new 4-classroom block at AJS

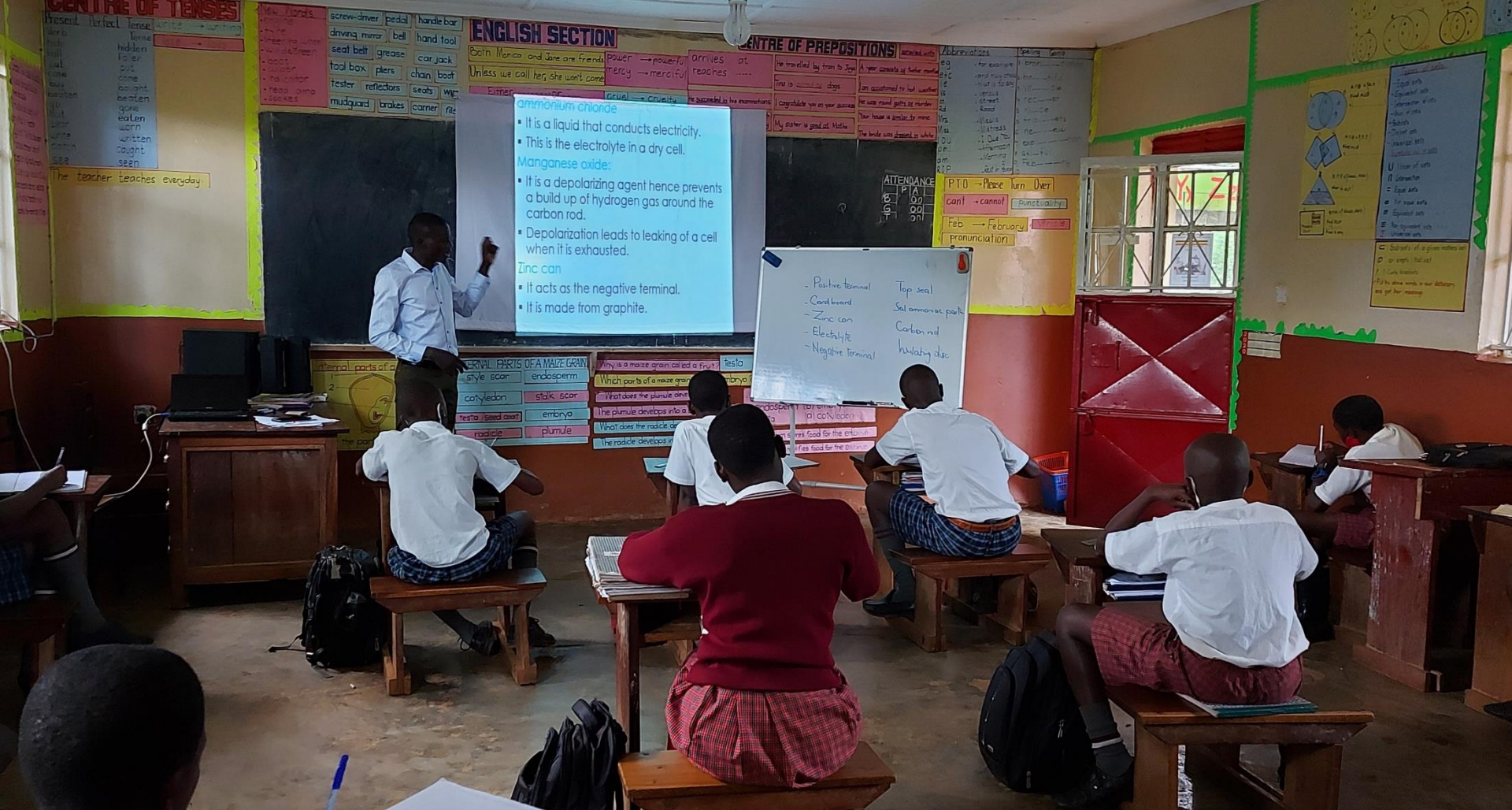


We added two rooms to our staff housing

Our Founders, John and Joyce Wanda, visited at the end of December 2021



By the Numbers in 2021:

- 473 students now enrolled at AJS
- 320 students enrolled at our sister school, MJS
- 353 students on scholarship at Secondary
- 135 students on scholarship at tertiary
- 23 Schools on our Outreach program
- 31,964 patients treated at AAH clinics
- 42 students graduated from university or tertiary institutions, bringing the total to 205
- 77 Staff (44 male, 33 female, 16 alumni)
